#### LHS BAND MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the LHS Band is to provide a quality music education to all students enrolled. The goal is to achieve quality by focusing on the individual performer. Wind Ensemble, Concert Band, Marching Band, Jazz Band, Pep Band, small ensembles, and solo experience leads to a well-rounded player. Performance opportunities, especially those through the Ohio Music Education Association, are encouraged for all. Additionally, through the Band, Students develop a sense of belonging, teamwork, time management, dedication, self-esteem, leadership, cooperation, and responsibility.

#### LHSDMB MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

The Dragon Marching Band is comprised of Students from the Band yearlong class. Students who enroll for Band are required to participate in the co-curricular aspects of the Dragon Marching Band. Points will be earned and lost in regards to participation, music checks, quizzes, and other assessments. LHSDMB Members are required to attend Summer Band Practices, which include Band Camp, as this is used to prepare the ensemble for the rest of the season. Failure to meet these requirements and/or participate fully will result in loss of points, loss of LHSDMB privileges, loss of performance opportunities (which will also result in loss of points), and/or removal from the ensemble and the yearlong course.

#### MARCHING BAND GUIDELINES & EXPECTATIONS

- 1. All Students signed up for Band will participate in Marching Band.
- 2. Twirlers who have auditioned and earned a spot on the corps will follow the expectations of the LHSDMB, as well as those set for the LHS Majorettes.
- 3. The Lakeside High School Dragon Marching Band will begin Summer Rehearsals on Monday, July 15th, at 9:00 AM.
- 4. LHSDMB Summer Rehearsals will occur as specified on the LHSDMB Calendar of Events.
- 5. ALL SUMMER REHEARSALS are mandatory for all members of the LHSDMB, unless given permission from Mr. Roth. As outlined on our website and through communiqués, vacations, work schedules, and other activities/appointments need to be scheduled to allow FULL PARTICIPATION in Summer Rehearsals. Missing a rehearsal MAY result in disciplinary action ranging from removal from a performance, making up the rehearsal on your time, or other actions deemed appropriate by Mr. Roth.
- 6. Be in your seat/spot ready to begin **ON TIME...EVERY TIME!!!!! LHSDMB Motto:** "To be early is to be on time...to be on time is to be late is to be left behind!"
- 7. All talking and playing MUST STOP IMMEDIATELY when any authorized person steps on the podium or in front of the group.
- 8. Do not talk or play when the Director or Drum Major stops conducting or cuts you off in order to give instructions or explanations.
- 9. During any field rehearsals, there will be no talking or movement of any kind after the To The Ready or Attention Command/Whistle has been given.
- 10. Students will never leave formation or the stands without the permission of the Director.
- 11. Students will wear proper footwear at all times during rehearsals/performances. Good tennis shoes/ sneakers with proper arch support should be used for rehearsals.
- 12. The Band Room will always be left in a neat and organized manner:
  - a. All instruments and music properly put away.
  - b. All instrument lockers are to be locked.
  - c. Percussion equipment should always be put away and handled with care.
  - d. All stands and chairs returned to their proper locations.
  - e. Failure to clean/organize your area will result in:
    - 1st Offense: Band Detention (serve one (1) hour of service for the Band Director)
    - 2<sup>nd</sup> and additional offenses: Lose 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter Privileges at the next FB Game AND Band Detention.
  - f. Drum Line Members are to put away all equipment at the end of rehearsal. No member of the Drum Line will be excused unless the following has occurred:
    - ALL instruments put away properly
    - ALL stands put away properly
    - ALL music in folders and put away
    - ALL mallets and sticks stored in their appropriate places

Failure to comply with this will result in an immediate Band Detention, with additional detentions and possible loss of 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter Privileges for each occurrence thereafter.

- 12. Have all equipment at all rehearsals and performances (instrument, music, reeds, oil, mutes, PENCILS, sticks, mallets, etc.):
  - a. All reed players should have several spare reeds. Do not wait until you use your last reed to purchase a new one.

- b. All brass players should have valve oil or slide oil. Please be sure to have your own supply and not rely on someone else to bring it.
- c. All percussion players should have appropriate sticks/mallets.
- d. Reeds, valve oil, etc. are available at area music stores and through the Director.
- 13. Students are required to provide their own instruments. Lakeside High School provides larger and more expensive instruments for Student use. Instrument Check-Out Forms for school instruments MUST be completed, signed, and returned to Mr. Roth PRIOR to instruments being used. See the attached form.
- 14. Students must ask for permission from the Director before entering into or getting equipment/items from the Band Storage Areas, Band Library, Uniform Room, Practice Rooms, or Band Office.
- 15. Each Student that is involved in the Instrumental Music Program is entitled to a locker in the Band Room. Only instruments will be stored in these lockers, not shoes, clothes, books, etc. A combination lock will be supplied with each locker and will be used to lock the locker. Failure to use the lock correctly will result in the loss of locker privileges. Lakeside High School and the Band Director are not responsible for the safety of instruments.
- 16. Vandalism with regard to instruments, equipment, and school property **WILL NOT BE TOLERATED!** Offenders will be held **FINANCIALLY RESPONSIBLE** and will receive a discipline referral.
- 17. Gum chewing, candy eating, food, drink, etc. are not permitted in the Band Room at any time, unless approved by the Director.
- 18. All instruments kept in the lockers must have the Student's name clearly printed on the outside of the case. See Mr. Roth for a nametag.
- 19. All rehearsals of the Dragon Marching Band are closed. This means that friends, family, boy/girlfriends, etc. are not to attend or 'visit' our rehearsals. With a limited amount of rehearsal time being used to produce an outstanding musical product, the presence of others will only distract us from our goal.
- 20. All Lakeside High School policies and expectations will be enforced. These include, but are not limited to, the dress code, illegal substance policy, behavior, etc. Any infraction of these rules will be swiftly and strictly acted upon.
- 21. Harassment of any kind (gender, ethnic, religious, disability, sexual, etc.) **WILL NOT BE TOLERATED!** Forms of harassment include, but are not limited to, <u>verbal</u> (written/oral innuendoes, comments, jokes, insults, threats, disparaging remarks, "campaign of silence," etc.), <u>nonverbal</u> (inappropriate objects, pictures, graphic commentaries, etc.), and <u>physical</u> (intimidating/disparaging action). Any infraction or instance of harassment will be swiftly and strictly acted upon.
- 22. There will be no public display of affection (PDA) when involved with any Band function.
- 23. Obscene language, rude behavior, or other actions considered inappropriate will not be tolerated during any Band activity. Members of the Lakeside High School Dragon Marching Band are examples and representatives of Lakeside High School and should act accordingly.
- 24. Insubordination or disrespect of the Director, Assistant Directors, Drum Line Instructor, Assistants, Advisor(s), Chaperones, or other individuals put in charge of or aiding students will not be tolerated.

#### **REQUIRED MATERIALS**

Each Member of the Dragon Marching Band should come to rehearsal with the following items. Failure to bring the expected/required materials may result in the loss of privileges and points.

- **Proper Footwear** Students shall wear tennis shoes/sneakers with socks to properly march on the field. Sandals, flip-flops, dress shoes (except during the school year), etc. are not permitted. Please have the proper shoes available for each rehearsal. 1st Offense Warning; 2nd Offense Removed From Rehearsal; 3rd Offense Removal From Ensemble
- Instrument & Related Items i.e. reeds, valve oil, etc.
- Music/Flip Folder & Lyre
- Drill Charts
- **Pencil** Each student must bring their own pencil to write in their music
- Other Suggested Items Sun block, sunglasses, hat, water bottle, etc.
- A Positive, Enthusiastic Attitude!!!!!

#### ATTENDANCE AND ABSENCE POLICIES FOR PERFORMANCES AND EXTRA REHEARSALS

By virtue of being a Member of the Lakeside High School Dragon Marching Band, you have accepted an obligation not only to yourself, but to the entire organization as well. Because it is our desire to achieve the finest possible results, attendance at all rehearsals and performances (including sporting events) by every Band member is mandatory. **PERFECT ATTENDANCE IS CONSIDERED THE NORM!** It would be unrealistic, however, to assume that absences due to illness, death in the family, or other valid circumstances would not occur. With this in mind, the following policy has been instituted to explain and define the Absence Policy of the Lakeside High School DMB during Summer Rehearsals. These regulations have been designed to maintain the excellence of the Lakeside High School Band, and will help to ensure that membership in this

group continues to be a worthwhile and rewarding experience for all. Furthermore, it is assumed that any student who becomes a member of the Lakeside High School Band recognizes his/her responsibility to fellow students of the organization and wishes to contribute his/her best effort at all times.

#### Procedure For Missing A Rehearsal or Performance Due To An Emergency/Illness

Absences from rehearsals and performances affect the ENTIRE DMB. With advanced notice, that Director can often make changes or adjust plans to accommodate an absence, minimizing the negative impact on the other students. Therefore, **absences must be reported with a phone call to (440) 993-2540 ahead of time.** Reporting an absence does not necessarily mean the absence will be counted as "excused."

#### Rehearsals And Performances

All LHSDMB Members are required to attend all rehearsals and performances. The ONLY excuses for missing rehearsals or performances are as follows:

- Family emergency
- Personal illness
- Extenuating circumstance, as deemed excused by Mr. Roth

Any unexcused absences from rehearsals or performances will result in one or more of the following:

- Deduction in grade
- Loss of performance opportunities
- Loss of organization privileges
- Removal from leadership responsibilities
- Other actions as deemed appropriate
- There are only a few "extenuating circumstances" that will be deemed by Mr. Roth as an excused absence from a performance. If an extenuating circumstance is in conflict with the Band calendar, the Director must be notified **no later than two (2) weeks before the performance conflict!** Please also note that work is never an excused absence. Students must make their employers aware of our schedule as soon as possible in order to prevent conflicts.

#### **Students In Other Activities**

Students who are involved in other activities must be constantly aware of conflicts which they may encounter. In the case of a Band performance and a performance in another school activity (sporting event), students are expected to try to participate in both events. In this case, students are permitted to travel with a parent to or from the Band event. When these conflicts arise, the director and coach/advisor should be notified in writing AT LEAST one (1) week prior to the event. Students may not drive themselves to or from any performance.

## A Band is only as strong as its weakest member! Attendance at Band rehearsals is extremely vital to the Band's success!

#### PERFECT ATTENDANCE AT ALL EVENTS IS CONSIDERED THE DORM!!!!!

#### Summer Rehearsals & Band Camp

Attendance at Summer Rehearsals and Band Camp are mandatory. These rehearsals are **crucial** to the Band's success. Failure to attend these rehearsals will result in one or more of the following:

- Loss of performance opportunities
- Removal from leadership responsibilities
- Removal from the ensemble
- Other actions as deemed appropriate

Dates for these rehearsals are announced WELL IN ADVANCE since they change on a yearly basis and to insure students' involvement.

A note (hand-written notification) from a Parent or Guardian with the following information must be submitted to the Director for an absence for consideration to be excused:

- a) Student's name
- b) Reason for the absence
- c) Date of the requested absence

- d) Phone number
- e) Parent's/Guardian's signature
- f) Verbal notifications, voicemail, or messages sent via e-mail will not be accepted.
- g) Just turning in the note DOES NOT deem the absence excused. Please plan/schedule accordingly.

An unexcused absence by one (1) LHSDMB Member has a negative effect on the performance level of the entire LHSDMB. The high level of performance that is expected and will be produced by the LHSDMB will be due to the pride and dedication of its students. Attendance is an important part of this pride and dedication.

#### Attendance At Rehearsal Prior To A Performance

Students are required to be in attendance at the rehearsal prior to a performance. Required rehearsals included under this policy are:

- 1. Weekly after-school rehearsals
- 2. School-Day rehearsal PRIOR to a performance
- 3. The after-school rehearsal on the day of a performance

An absence of any kind from said rehearsal will result in the student not being able to participate in the performance and the possible loss of all points that would have been earned. Please plan accordingly when making appointments and other arrangements.

#### **TARDINESS POLICIES**

#### To be early is to be on time - to be on time is to be late - to be late is to be left behind!

Students are expected to be punctual for all Band events. For example, if the rehearsal is scheduled for 6:00 PM, the student should arrive with adequate time to warm-up and prepare for the rehearsal to <u>begin</u> at 6:00 PM, this would mean arriving by 5:45 PM or earlier.

Tardiness at a rehearsal may result in temporary suspension from future Band activities and/or loss of 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter privileges. Tardiness at a performance may result in the student not participating in the performance.

Please plan accordingly.


#### **BAND STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT**

As part of the Lakeside Instrumental Music Program, your actions, both in and out of uniform, are a direct reflection upon the Band, school, and community. Conduct yourself with dignity and pride at all times. The rules set forth in the school conduct code are in full effect throughout any performance or rehearsal.

The Band Director has designed this set of consequences to meet any discipline problems that may occur. Depending on the severity of the infraction any order or combination of consequences may apply. Consistent infractions will result in additional consequences including school-given punishments, as outlined in the Lakeside High School Student Code of Conduct.

#### **Behavior Consequences**

- 1. Verbal/Written Warning
- 2. Loss of Free Time or points deducted from Daily Participation
- 3. Disciplinary Isolation from Group
- 4. Removal from Rehearsal/Performance
- 5. Detention/Mandatory Band Service Time
- 6. Loss of Leadership Status within the Band
- 7. Conference
- 8. **Performance Suspension:** Student must attend the performance with the group but cannot participate in the performance.



- 9. **Performance Expulsion:** Student <u>is not</u> permitted to attend the performance as a member of the ensemble or as a spectator. Failure to accept this condition will result in the immediate referral to school administration. Grades will be affected by the missed rehearsals or performances during this time. Finally, students may not participate in any after school band activities for the duration of the punishment.
- 10. Referral to Administration/Legal Authorities
- 11. \* Suspension
- 12. \* Expulsion
- \* School Given Consequences

Hazing or activities geared towards demeaning or embarrassing Band members will not be tolerated. Students who participate in any hazing or harassing activity will immediately face disciplinary action per the Lakeside High School Student Code of Conduct and may be removed from the organization. Please review said policy in the Lakeside High School Student Handbook. All members in the Lakeside High School Dragon Marching Band are important and vital and will be treated as such. Our ultimate goal of being the best Band possible should always be striven for!

#### Music/Routine Memorization Checks

- 1. All music/routines performed by the LHSDMB in public will be memorized, with the exception of stands tunes.
- 2. A specific date will be given when each piece of Music /Routine is due to be memorized.
- 3. ALL Band members/Twirlers are required to complete Music/Routine checks.
- 4. Music/Routine Checks are done during Marching Band Season. They are done to insure that the music/routine has been memorized and is being performed correctly.
- 5. Music checks are a part of your grade for Band.
- 6. The following guidelines are used for music checks:
  - Section Leaders will play their music checks for Mr. Roth/Mrs. Nelling
  - Band members will play their music checks to Section Leaders or Mr. Roth/Mrs. Nelling.
  - On or before that date, the music/routine must be "checked off" by either Mr. Roth/Mrs. Nelling/Miss Stoneman or authorized individual.
- 7. Points for Music Memos will be discussed in the Band Handbook.
- 8. Inability to play off the required Memorization Checks will result in not participating in the performance of said music or routine AND losing points!!!!!
- 9. Chronic failure of Music/Routine Checks will lead to additional disciplinary action, which may include loss of privileges, dismissal from the performing group, etc.

#### **FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT**

The Ashtabula Area City School District is not responsible for stolen or damaged instruments that are owned, rented, or borrowed by the Students. The Band Room/E103 is not secure 100% of the time so it is a good idea to lock your cases. Parents may wish to insure their Student's instrument under their homeowner's or renter's policy. Students must take proper care of their instruments, including not leaving them in practice rooms, classrooms, buses, hallways, or on the floor in the storage room. Only Percussion Students are permitted to play, touch, or move percussion instruments.

#### **School-Owned Instruments**

All school-owned instruments must be signed out by the Director. Students must take excellent care of school-owned instruments in their possession. It is the responsibility of the student to notify the Director of any damage. Students can and will be held responsible for any damage from horseplay or negligence. In these circumstances, cost of repair will rest solely with the student and his/her parents. At the end of the year, all instruments must be checked in. Reeds and slide grease, and valve oil are not provided, but can be purchased at area music stores or through the Director.

#### **Instrument Requirements**

We expect that all students have instruments in good working condition. All woodwind players should always have at least 3 spare reeds. Brass Students should have valve oil, rotor oil, or slide grease/cream available. All slides should function on brass instruments without any hesitation. If a student or parent would like to investigate purchasing a step-up instrument, please contact the Director and they can help guide you in your decision. Sometimes a better mouthpiece (for both brass and woodwinds) can make a large difference. Of course a pencil is the most important item to have with you at all times. If an instrument becomes damaged, always take it to a music store with an "in house" repair shop. These stores have the fastest services and generally do the best work.



#### Use and Care of Music

- 1. Do not fold, tear, or otherwise mutilate music.
- 2. Use only pencil when marking music.
- 3. Students can be held financially responsible for music that is not cared for properly.

#### **PERFORMANCE ATTIRE**

It is extremely important to our appearance that we look as uniform as possible. The professionalism, pride, and self-respect that a uniform appearance lends to a group are a positive influence on the overall affect of their performance. It will be our goal and our individual responsibility to secure the required uniform and wear it in the correct and appropriate fashion.

#### **Marching Band Uniform Policy**

Marching Band Uniforms are provided by Lakeside High School and the Lakeside Music Boosters. You are responsible for the proper use, maintenance, and return of all items issued by the Instrumental Music Department. Fees will be assessed for lost or damaged articles, and grades will be withheld until all items are returned in proper condition or replacement fees paid. All Band members will be furnished the LHSDMB T-Shirt, which shall be worn for all Marching Band performances unless instructed differently by the Director. Instrumentalists are required to furnish black socks, black Marching Band shoes, and approved accessories. The required Marching Band shoes must be purchased through the Uniform Manager.

#### Money for said purchases MUST BE PROVIDED PRIOR to receiving the uniform parts.

The Summer MB Uniform will consist of the following:

- ↓ LHSDMB T-Shirt
- Black Shorts
- Black Socks
- Black Marching Shoes
- The Summer MB Uniform can be modified by Mr. Roth.

The LHSDMB Performance Uniform will consist of the following:

- LHSDMB T-Shirt
- Uniform Jacket
- Uniform Pants
- Uniform Hat
- White Gloves
- Black Socks
- Black Marching Shoes

The following guidelines will be followed when wearing the LHSDMB Uniform:

- 1. The LHSDMB T-Shirt will be worn at all times beneath the Marching Band Uniform.
- 2. Hair in Marching Band for both men and women is to be off the collar. Hair touching the collar must be fastened up with rubber bands. No bow or hair accessories may be showing.
- 3. Make-up should be conservative so as to fit in with the entire group. No glitter or striking shades are permitted unless the Director approves in advance. Make-up should never be applied in uniform. Face paints are never permitted in uniform.

- 4. No jewelry/items are permitted **ON** the uniform, unless approved by the Director. Earrings will not be worn at any time by either gender.
- 5. No hats are to be worn with the uniform other than the Marching Band hat, unless approved by the Director.
- 6. Marching Shoes must be cleaned/shined before each performance.
- 7. Black socks are required.

Replacement items for the Marching Band Uniform should be acquired PRIOR to the performance from the Uniform Manager. Payment prior to receiving said replacements is required.

Any offense of the above will result in at least the loss of credit for the performance, or at most removed from the privilege of performing and loss of credit as above.

#### **Uniform Inspections**

Section Leaders will do a preliminary check to make sure that all parts of the uniform are being worn AND in good, CLEAN condition.

The Drum Major and/or the Director will conduct final inspections. Failure to pass a uniform inspection will incur the following disciplinary action(s):


- 1. First Offense Verbal warning and opportunity to fix the discrepancy.
- 2. Second Offense 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter/Free-Time privileges will be revoked for the current performance and one (1) Band Detention after the current performance and opportunity to fix the discrepancy.
- 3. Third Offense Student will not perform with the DMB and will have 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter Free-Time privileges revoked for the current performance and opportunity to fix the discrepancy.
- 4. Fourth Offense Student will not perform with the DMB and will have 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter privileges revoked for the rest of the Marching Season and opportunity to fix the discrepancy.

In the event the student cannot fix the discrepancy, said student will not perform and will lose all points possible for the performance, as well as privileges provided during the performance. Additional disciplinary action may be taken at the discretion of the Band Director.

#### Care Of The Marching Band Uniform After A Performance

All uniform parts and accessories are to be stored in the Uniform Room after each performance. Students are permitted to take uniforms home in order to have them dry-cleaned in the event of need. <u>ALL PARTS</u> of the uniform should be properly stored and hung up. Failure to do so may damage or dirty the uniform, which may cause the student to not be permitted to perform with the group.

Failure to properly store the uniform may result in being benched for the next performance and/or loss of privileges during the game.



#### What is Band Camp?

Band Camp is a week long camp where music rehearsals and fun activities are scheduled from 7:00 AM -10:00 PM each day to prepare the Dragon Marching Band for its upcoming marching season.

Band Camp will be held at Slippery Rock University in Slippery Rock, PA, where Students will be housed in air-conditioned dorms at night, rehearse during the day, and eat their meals in the campus cafeteria.

Band Camp provides the Dragon Marching Band the opportunity to learn and perfect the Band's Pre-Game and first Half-Time Show, working cooperatively, while developing the Band's *esprit de corps* and sense of unity.

PICK-UP: 3:30 PM, Wednesday, July 31st, at Lakeside High School, following the Parent

Preview Performance.

**STAFF:** Band Directors, instrument specialists, a nurse, and male and female parent

chaperones.

**HOUSING:** Students and Chaperones will be housed in a dormitory-style building. The building

is fully air-conditioned, has separate wings for boys and girls, a central dining hall, and recreation room. Students will pick their own roommates (four to a room), upon completion of Band Camp Registration. Chaperones will make rounds to make sure

student rooms are quiet.

**MEALS:** All meals will be prepared by the Slippery Rock University food service kitchen staff.

The camp is very accommodating of dietary needs, so if you have any, please

contact Mr. Roth at your earliest convenience.

**BAND CAMP COST:** The cost of Band Camp is \$270.00, which must be paid in full prior to the Student

attending Band Camp. The balance is due no later than Friday, July 26th!

Financial reasons should not limit a Student's involvement in Band or for not attending Band Camp. As Band Camp is required for Marching Band (and the yearlong Band Class), every Student will be given the opportunity to participate fully. Arrangements/Payment Plans can be set up and assist those that need assistance. Please contact Mr. Roth in regards to this assistance.

#### **BAND CAMP REGISTRATION**

- Registration for this year's Band Camp will ONLY be held on Tuesday, July 23rd, and Thursday, July 25th, from 6 PM to 8 PM, in the LHS Band Room. These are the only days to complete your registration for Band Camp.
- Student Registration will confirm:
  - o Band Fees balance is paid in full.
  - Emergency Medical Papers are completed.
  - All Medications are turned in to the Band Camp Nurse (and logged on the Emergency Medical Form).
  - Additional completed necessary forms.

#### Your attention to these items prior to Band Camp will aid in Check-In at Slippery Rock University.

#### **LAKESIDE BAND CAMP NURSE & MEDICATIONS**

- All medications with the exception of Birth Control and/or EpiPens, will be turned into the Camp Nurse and/or Band Director designee.
- Medications are turned into the nurse for your child's safety and the safety of others (including over-the-counter medications and/or vitamins).
- All medications will be administered from the Nurse.
- Please do not leave any medical information off of the <u>Emergency Medical Form</u>. This information will be held confidentially.
- If an inhaler or EpiPen is required, please bring two (2), one (1) for your child to have with them at all times, and the other for the camp nurse.
- Please make sure the telephone numbers provided on the Emergency Medical Form are numbers where we can easily contact you.
- The nurse will have a small supply of over-the-counter medications. If the nurse determines your child needs medicine not listed on the Emergency Medical Form, the nurse will contact you for your consent before any medication is administered.
- If you anticipate your child will have a special medical need at Band Camp, please contact Mr. Roth so accommodations can be made with the camp, school staff, and camp.
- In the absence of a Volunteer Parent Nurse (RN, LPN, or Paramedic), the Band Directors or Designee will administer medications.

#### **STUDENT DROP-OFF**

Students are to be dropped off by their Parents (or designee) starting at 1 PM and no later than 2:30 PM at Slippery Rock University (Location TBA). We will have our first meeting at 2:30 PM, with our first field rehearsal beginning at 3 PM, so Students should have plenty of time to acclimate themselves to SRU and prepare for our first rehearsal.

#### PARENT PREVIEW PERFORMANCE / PICK-UP

On the last day of camp, the LHSDMB will present a 3:00 PM Parent Preview Performance at Lakeside High School. The performance will be a showing of what we have accomplished at Band Camp and a preview of our show. The performance will take place in Lakeside Stadium.

#### **BAND CAMP RULES**

- 1. All Dragon Marching Band, Lakeside High School, and Slippery Rock University Rules are in effect at all times. Students are subject to disciplinary action outlined in Lakeside High School's Student Conduct Handbook.
- 2. ABSOLUTELY no hazing of students will be tolerated. That means if you are "picking on someone" you will be sent home.
- 3. The Directors, Assistants, Chaperones, and Camp Staff MUST be obeyed and treated with respect.
- 4. Smoking materials, tobacco products, non-prescription drugs, or alcoholic beverages ARE NOT permitted at Band Camp.
- 5. Absolutely no guys in girls' halls/rooms and no girls in guys' halls/rooms during free time or any other time. No chaperone has discretion or authority to allow otherwise. **If you break this rule, you will be sent home.**
- 6. No returning to the dorm at any time, other than free time, except by permission of Mr. Roth and you must be accompanied by a Chaperone.
- 7. No one is permitted out of the dorms after lights out, and before the morning time stated on the schedule.
- 8. Students are not to leave the Slippery Rock University facilities at any time. **If you break this rule, you will be sent home.**
- 9. No excuses for tardiness will be accepted.
- 10. Band members must wear tennis shoes and SOCKS on the field at all times.
- 11. Dorms will be kept clean at all times. There will be inspection of dorm rooms by the Directors every morning.

#### TRANSPORTATION TO/FROM BAND CAMP

- 1. The School DOES NOT provide transportation TO Band Camp.
- 2. The School WILL provide transportation FROM Band Camp.
- 3. Carpooling is permitted and encouraged with Parent permission
- 4. Students are NOT permitted to drive themselves or other Students to Band Camp (no exceptions).
- 5. Drum Line and Sousaphones will load their instruments and equipment on the Dragon Wagon on Friday after rehearsal. All other students will transport their instruments, music, and accessories to Band Camp. **THIS MEANS THEY MUST BE TAKEN HOME FRIDAY AFTER BAND.**
- 6. <u>If you are sending your child to Band Camp with another adult, we need you to complete the attached Transportation Form.</u>
- 7. Students need to make sure they have all of their gear for Band Camp removed from the Band Room on Friday after rehearsal. The Band Staff will be at Band Camp setting up all-day Sunday, thus there will not be any opportunities for Students to "get back into the Band Room" after Friday.

#### VISITATION DURING THE WEEK

- No one is to visit Band Camp during the week.
- Please contact Mr. Roth in regards to special circumstances.

#### ADDITIONAL BAND CAMP CONSIDERATIONS

- Students are permitted to bring bottled water, clear liquids, and small snacks. No meat or dairy products or any other perishable items are permitted in the rooms.
- Bringing snack items is a privilege not a right. If your room is not kept clean, we reserve the right to box up your food and return it to you at the end of the week.
- The Student Dorm does have vending machines where students can buy pop, chips, cookies and candy.
- Students will be permitted to bring the following to Band Camp:
  - o One (1) large suitcase
  - o One (1) bookbag/gym bag
  - o Disposable bags with non-perishable food items, etc.

- o Items that are listed on the included Packing List
- o Their instrument (unless they are in the Drum Line or Sousaphones)
- o No TVs, game systems, monitors, etc. ARE PERMITTED at Band Camp.
