

WILLIAM H. SEARCY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION INFORMATION

William H. Searcy was superintendent of the Ashtabula County Schools for 19 years, beginning in August 1966 and ending with his death in December 1985. Mr. Searcy's educational career spanned 38 years. He dedicated his life to the education of youth in Ashtabula County, as well as in the state.

1. Applicants for the William H. Searcy Memorial Scholarship must submit a typed essay, of no more than two pages, indicating his/her rationale for consideration by the scholarship committee.
2. Applicants must supply an official transcript of credit with the completed application and 2 letters of reference. Transcripts are available through the high school guidance counselor. Forms for the letters of reference are included in this packet.
3. To be considered a qualified applicant for the William H. Searcy Memorial Scholarship, a student must meet the following criteria:
 - a. Be enrolled in an approved program for the preparation of teachers;
 - b. **Be in the top twenty-five percent of his/her graduating class;**
 - c. Be of sound character;
 - d. Demonstrate above-average achievement on college entrance exams;
 - e. Demonstrate involvement in extracurricular and community service;
 - f. Be from one of the public schools in Ashtabula County
4. The William H. Searcy Memorial Scholarship will consist of payment of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) each year, for four years, with grades reviewed each year, payable to the recipient. Payment will be made upon verification of successful completion of the first semester of each year. ***There will be two recipients selected each year.***
5. The recipients of the William H. Searcy Scholarship will be required to submit college transcripts and a course schedule each year.
6. **All applications must be delivered and/or postmarked to the William H. Searcy Memorial Foundation by Friday, April 1, 2022 at 3:00 p.m. The applicant is responsible for all application materials and for meeting the specified requirements.**
7. A complete application consists of the following:
 - a. **Completed application**
 - b. **High school transcript**
 - c. **Two letters of reference, collected and submitted to the guidance counselor**
 - d. **Essay**
